

Director's Message

As we all know, summer is over and fall has arrived faster than any of us like. It is getting colder, wetter, and less daylight has shortened our motorcycle riding time. Some of us are fair weather riders and are 'winterizing' our bikes, and others are preparing their bikes for winter riding. For those of us that are year-around riders, I have a few tips:

- Make sure your bike is in good condition Perform a T CLOCS inspection (Tires and Wheels, Controls, Lights and Electrical, Engine Oil and Fluids, Chassis and Side stand) is extra important when it's cold out. Paradise Harley-Davidson service department can help you keep your bike in tiptop condition.
- Dress for the weather base layer clothing, rain gear, heated gear, and heated gloves (if you don't have heated grips). Fog free full-face helmet and neck gaiter are a must to have. Remember to keep feet warm and dry! It is scientifically proven that as your body becomes hypothermic, you lose concentration and manual dexterity in hands and feet. Paradise has in-boot toe warmers, as does Cycle Gear and Costco. Check weather conditions and plan your route. If the weather is iffy, park it and ride another day. Take a look at the wind chill temperature chart here: https://www.norcalpgr.org/wind_chill_charts.html.
- Carry extra items in your tour pack or backpack, such as hand warmers, extra socks, first aid kit, external batteries, and road safety items.
- Consider always riding with a partner, just in case something happens and you require someone to obtain help for you. Take breaks often from riding, more often than when riding in fair weather.
- Always, and I mean ALWAYS, let someone know your route and expected time of return.
- Stay alert! When riding in fall and winter, be aware of your surroundings. Wet roads and wet leaves make the road slippery. Watch for frost, black ice, or sand on the roads, especially in the curves where trees can block the sun. It's crucial to know that tire traction can be lost in a second. Slow down and keep it at a manageable speed. Enjoy the ride.



While recovering at home, a HOG brother came by the house & took me to and from a Chapter meeting. After I recovered, a HOG brother took me to Paradise H-D to pick up my new 2024 Heritage & escorted me home.

So now you can see why I feel this HOG Chapter #1814 really is FAMILY!

I hope to continue to expand our membership and help all to feel welcomed and cared for.

When asked questions about how life is and how they differ from the lives of those who don't have it is hard to explain to those who have never experienced it.
