

Customizing Your Ride

There are many things that set Harley-Davidson apart from other motorcycles. Perhaps the biggest point of separation is the availability of parts and accessories. When it comes to fit, function and style the options for customizing your bike are limited only to your imagination.

Last month we thought it would be fun to take a Harley-Davidson Street 750 and convert it into a dual sport Scrambler. While this project entailed more than just buying parts off the shelf and hanging them on the bike with just a bit more ingenuity and a fairly handy technician we were able to successfully pull off our objective. Here is a brief overview of what we did.

First we removed the small headlight fairing and replaced the stock handle bars with some more aggressive Renthal off-road bars. The rear end of the bike comes from the factory with a plain looking one piece license plate holder, brake light and turn signal unit. We sent that to the scrap heap and added a custom bracket for a license plate with LED light for illumination. Then we mounted Sportster turn signals directly on the rear fender. Since we foresee the Scrambler doing some light duty off-road work we thought it important to tackle the stock cast wheels. In their place we used H-D hubs to lace up a 21 inch front wheel and an 18 inch rear wheel. The 21" front wheel required a new front fender, so we ordered in a Buell Ulysses front fender and attached it to the triple tree with a simple custom bracket. Since the wheels changed, we had to update the sprocket gear and did a conversion from the factory belt drive to a chain drive to avoid rocks from breaking a belt.

Finally, we went to work on the exhaust by wrapping the pipes with heat tape and adding SM mufflers. The final product looks completely different than the factory bike and broadens the bikes functionality from street only to street and light off-road. Furthermore the use of H-D wheel hubs and Buell front fender means these components don't effect the factory warranty. Check out the before and after photo's to see how we transformed a factory Street 750 to the Paradise Speed Shop Scrambler!

You too can customize your motorcycle to look, feel and ride the way you want. Let your imagination run wild and come see us at Paradise to help make your dreams come true!



Practice starting, stopping, emergency stops, slow maneuvers, tight turns, slow creeping in a straight line. Anything that gets you "back in the saddle" and brings your confidence and skills back. I got the draft notice for the Army in 1967 when I was in New Jersey. I went back home to Milpitas, CA and enlisted in the Navy. (I thought the Navy was safer than the Army during the Vietnam War.)

I was assigned to tug boat duty in San Diego. My main responsibility was cooking for a crew of 9. I was famous for my fresh baked bread. Often the bread would disappear before the meal it was intended for. I started making twice the amount needed to keep the crew happy. I didn't want to make any "waves".

I was active duty in the Navy for 2 years then in 1969 I went into the Reserves for 4 more years. I was honorably discharged in 1973.

ANDY LESTER

I served in the USAF for 20 years and 24 days; from 6 July 1994 till I retired from Active Duty on 30 July 2014. I was stationed at Offutt AFB NE, Izmir Turkey, Wright-Patterson AFB OH, RAF Molesworth UK, McConnell AFB KS, and at Patch Barracks Stuttgart Germany.

I was served temporary duty/deployed to many locations to include the Balkans, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and Djibouti, just to name a few locations. This is a pic from Oct when I bought my CVO that brought me to this chapter.


brought in a nice crowd with appetites for BBQ ribs and chicken and amazing mac and cheese. Ron Simmons did a great job on the barbecue as always.




