Motorcycle Etiquette 101

If you're riding your motorcycle and you happen to see a stranded biker at the side of the road, it's your duty as a fellow biker to stop and help them. Nine times out of 10, they've broken down and are waiting for a tow truck. If this is the case, you can bid your farewell and be on your way.

BUT what if they've fallen off and banged their head? Or worse, what if they've been knocked off? What if they're in a panic and need someone to take charge? Don't assume that a biker is okay just because they 'look' okay, AND don't assume that somebody else is coming to help them.

Slow down, flip up your visor, and show them a thumbs up to ask if they're okay. If everything is fine, they'll return the thumbs up and wave you on.

Good July everyone.

This is Chili, (Dennis Palmer) your Road Captain speaking,

Summer is here, the heat is on, and the rides continue!! There are so many exciting rides coming up in the next few months that I felt I should touch bases on a few suggestions to help the RC's lead their rides! So, to follow, are a few pieces of advice that will help in the summer and of course all year long!

1. U-Turns are ALLOWED, they are called "Peeks". "Hey, I just wanted to take a peek further up that road!"
2. Left turns should be a last resort, especially with a large crowd and most certainly from a parking lot onto a busy street! (I have made that mistake... Once!)
3. Plan your stops closer together. Riding in the heat will take it out of everyone, so stop more often where you can get folks into shade, relax, and drink some cold water.
4. Know your designated "meet spots". You can find them on the website.
5. On warmer days plan your rides away from hotter areas, if possible, and try to leave earlier in the morning to ride in the cool morning air.

6. Remember to bring "Ride Sign-In Sheet" and plenty of waivers for guests.

7. DO NOT DRINK ALCOHOL during the ride. First, it is against our Charter Rules, 2nd, it will dehydrate you faster than not drinking water and lastly DON'T ride drunk...

8. Try not to pull away from your stops and leave someone behind. Please take a count before leaving.

9. Adding to number 8, a designated sweep with a way to communicate is always the best way to keep the group all together. Nothing like walking out of the store to find your group left you behind...

10. Plan your routes, pre ride them, if possible, plan good stops for fuel, food and breaks where you are sure you can get your group to park safely.

11. Ride safe, ride fun and ride your own rides everyone!!

2021 is turning out to being a great year for the Club. It is only mid-June and we have already logged over 76,000 miles for the club. That is fantastic after last year. More miles are there to be had... Safety Officer Al Navarro

We just rolled in from a great weekend ride to Morro Bay and we shared some great times and stories that got me to thinking about some of the issues we face as motorcycle enthusiasts. One of the major issues we all face is not our own action but the actions of other motorists we share the road with. On our ride home we had to deal with the Sunday traffic congestion due to a large number of people heading home and road work which led to us having to split lanes to keep moving.

Some of the following is **my own opinion and preferences** and some comes from the CHP website at www.chp.ca.gov. As a group on a chapter ride, We DO NOT spit lanes to our destination and I hope all our Road Captains know this and can think on the fly and revise routes when heavy traffic is encountered. Once the ride is declared over and you make your way home you can do as you feel necessary to get you home safely. Personally, I split lanes but only when I feel it is safe to do so. If I can maintain 40 mph or more I prefer to stay in the lane. And I NEVER EVER split lanes at night, but I have seen people do it. It's not safe in my opinion.

In California we have been able to split or share lanes for some time although it was not considered legal to do so until January 1, 2017, when section 21658.1 was added to the California Vehicle Code and defined lane splitting. Prior to this it was somewhat confusing for some motorists as it was not actually legal but was allowed as long as it was done in a safe manner. At one time the CHP had published some guidelines which in part seemed to show their approval of lane splitting. These guidelines detailed the recommended positions and speeds (which stated 15 mph over the surrounding traffic speed) but due to pressure from some activist groups they were deleted.

The following is CVC 21658.1 in its entirety:

- (a) For the purposes of this section, "lane splitting" means driving a motorcycle, as defined in Section 400, that has two wheels in contact with the ground, between rows of stopped or moving vehicles in the same lane, including on both divided and undivided streets, roads, or highways.
- (b) The Department of the California Highway Patrol may develop educational guidelines relating to lane splitting in a manner that would ensure the safety of the motorcyclist and the drivers and passengers of the surrounding vehicles.
- (c) In developing guidelines pursuant to this section, the department shall consult with agencies and organizations with an interest in road safety and motorcyclist behavior, including, but not limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) The Department of Motor Vehicles.
 - (2) The Department of Transportation.
 - (3) The Office of Traffic Safety.
 - (4) A motorcycle organization focused on motorcyclist safety

Lane Splitting Safety Tips for Motorcyclists

- ◆ Consider the total environment when you are lane splitting (this includes the width of lanes, the size of surrounding vehicles, as well as current roadway, weather, and lighting conditions).
- ◆ Danger increases at higher speed differentials.
- ◆ Danger increases as overall speed increases.
- ◆ It is typically safer to split between the far left lanes than between the other lanes of traffic.
- ◆ Avoid lane splitting next to large vehicles (big rigs, buses, motorhomes, etc.).
- ◆ Riding on the shoulder is illegal; it is not considered lane splitting.
- ◆ Be visible – Avoid remaining in the blind spots of other vehicles or lingering between vehicles.
- ◆ Help drivers see you by wearing brightly colored/reflective protective gear and using high beams during daylight

Remember, Ride Safe and within your own limitations to return home every time!

The risk of death or serious injury during a lane splitting collision increases as speed and speed differential increases. These general safety tips are provided to assist you in the practice; however, they are not guaranteed to keep you safe. Every rider has the ultimate responsibility for their own decision-making and safety.


