Hello!!!...First off I would like to say hi to our new members and welcome aboard!!

Another awesome riding season is upon us and the weather is definitely starting to get a little warmer. With that being said I would like to send out a few tips about riding in the heat.

1. Watch very carefully for signs of heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Your body will send you signals that it's having trouble with the heat which can include cramps, headache, nausea, pale skin, dizziness and heavy sweating. If you're feeling these symptoms it's time to pull over, rehydrate, rest and recover for as long as it takes. Don't be in a rush to get back on that bike.
2. Bring more water than you'll think you need. Water is vital for keeping the body cool. It also cushions your organs and tissues, so when you get dehydrated your body just won't work properly. So it's HUGELY important to stay hydrated. So drink plenty of water before you get on the bike and at least 32oz. of water every hour.
3. Dress properly and keep your skin covered. Any area of skin that is exposed will be much harder to cool. I wear a light colored long sleeve shirt and a mesh jacket. Wear a cooling vest if you have one !!

Ditto EVERYTHING that our Road Captain Mick stated in his article regarding "Activities Meetings" (he stole my thunder!).


Member participation is greatly requested and welcomed. Our ride calendar is created by our members and your input is greatly appreciated.

Survival Depends on the Choices We Make!



Skill is NOT Enough—Survival depends on the choices we make.

With many years of experience on two wheels, I've faced innumerable 'tests' on the road and, thankfully, I've passed them all. That must sound like I've got super-human riding skills. I do not - and never did. My skills have never been greater than 'competent'. My opinion is that a competent rider has skills that are adequate to successfully deal with virtually any threat presented. But there are others out there who possess particular riding skills that are enormously better than mine ever were, and yet several of those others are likely to be involved in life-threatening accidents sooner or later.

Why is that? Let's get past the obvious - some accidents are truly unavoidable. Larry Grotzky was perhaps the world's best known motorcycle safety guru. No question that he knew what he was doing and that he behaved with safety foremost in his mind, yet at 55 years of age, while riding in Texas a couple of years ago, he died after colliding with a deer. It was not the result of rider errors or lack of skills. Every licensed motorcycle rider CAN apply their brakes and slow, or bring their motorcycles to a stop from any speed. They CAN shift gears. They CAN twist their right wrists in order to change speed. Those are only examples of fundamental skills.

Rider errors, the greatest cause of motorcycle accidents and the resulting injuries and deaths, are examples of DOING or NOT DOING something with skill. So, it might occur to you that the way you stay healthy while continuing to ride is to develop your skills through practice and by taking advanced riding classes to improve your knowledge and your riding skills. In my opinion, merely being able to respond properly to any given threat is not enough - that is, having the skill to deal with a situation is important, but inadequate.

Motor cycling is a huge mental endeavor. Judgment and caution are not skills - they are mental strategies we use to stay safe out on the road.. Becoming skillful is primarily a muscle management ability that is obtained by practice. MASTERY is primarily a mental management ability that is obtained by simply making good choices.

It is not a throw away line to suggest that being a master at something involves being able to, but positioning yourself to never have to, demonstrate that mastery by using your expert judgment skills rather than your expert riding skills to stay safe out on the road.

Greetings Everyone,



Grand Canyon Village Ride


May 20-22, 2022

The Dan Alexander Fund

Memorializing lost friends and family is nothing new. For IEHOG it began decades ago. We lost members of IEHOG and in their honor the chapter developed a charity fund to help non-profit groups that our chapter members were passionate about. To explain the origin of the Dan Alexander fund, we have to go back to 1997.

In the early 90's we had a chapter member by the call name "Drifter". Drifter's given name was Frank Charles Hardt. He was very active in IEHOG and participated in and donated much time into our various rides, events, activities, including volunteering at our dealership which at that time was "Skip Fordyce Harley Davidson".

Drifter started a biker get together at what was once Sunnymead Burgers in Moreno Valley. He was friendly with the owners and convinced them to open their back parking lot to our chapter the first Friday of the month. We had raffles, bike games, music, plaques & trophies for the different categories of bikes (best of show, best paint, best bagger, etc.).

Drifter was a "kid" at heart, so he made sure there were always games and prizes for the little ones that would come with their parents. All of the prizes were donated by various businesses that Drifter would solicit each and every month. We had a business that would sponsor the various bike plaques as well. "Sunnymead Bike Night" ran for 10 years.

Drifter came upon hard financial times in 1997. He "sold" his bike to Skips. Skips held on to his bike (his baby) giving Drifter a chance to get on his financial feet again. Unfortunately, that never happened. Drifter took a job with a cab company out of San Bernardino and on his first night out, March 16, 1997, he was found shot to death in his cab. No arrests were ever made.

Drifter touched the hearts of all who knew him. So in his honor, IEHOG created the "Drifter Fund". The fund was comprised of partial chapter membership dues, fundraisers we did throughout the year, and sometimes when members won the 50/50, they would donate their winnings back into the fund. At the end of each year, the membership would suggest non-profit organizations that were local and children oriented. The money was donated to such places as the Children's Burn Unit for the Fire Dept; Garden of Angels; and the Riverside Juvenile Diabetes Foundation. The donation was also made in honor of one of our member's son who resided at "Totally Kids" Rehabilitation Hospital in San Bernardino due to a terrible pool accident.



The next "fund" that was voted on by chapter membership was in honor of Dan Alexander who passed away July 19, 2019. So many of us knew Dan. Dan was also heavily involved and active with our chapter as well as Skip Fordyce and continued on his enthusiastic gift of himself with our current dealership, Riverside Harley Davidson.

Dan was Road Captain for IEHOG, but more importantly if he was your friend, he was your friend for life!! He watched over each of us on our rides whether he was leading or riding sweep. From a personal experience, Kathy had an accident on a ride when Brian, her husband, was not there because of a work commitment. Kathy continued the ride. "Dan stayed with me until I had the bike parked in the garage at home and Brian got home from work. Dan wanted to assure Brian that I was not hurt and not left alone!"

Dan too, was a "kid" at heart, and was very involved with his kids and grandchildren growing up. He volunteered in all their sports and groups such as soccer, little league, cub scouts, boy scouts, and worked and volunteered with local schools. Dan was instrumental in initiating what is known as VIP-AYSO (a Very Important Player) soccer division for developmentally disabled children and adults in Moreno Valley and the Inland Empire.



Those that knew Dan can all agree, Dan left us way too soon. Dan had certain rides he liked and ones he "was going to do when he retired". One in particular was Sturgis. In August 2020 a few of the IEHOG members made that journey for him, spreading his ashes along the way. Dan was riding right there beside them!!!

As Kathy said at the end of her write up, "I am proud of the I.E. Chapter for continuing this great legacy since 1997."

Harley-Davidson was born out of boyhood friendship and grew into a globally recognized brand that changed the face of transportation and American culture. In 2003, a Harley-Davidson® statue was unveiled in Littleport, Cambridgeshire, where Harley's father had been born. What year was Harley inducted into the Motorcycle Hall of Fame?

IT'S A TRAGEDY -
THERE WERE NO
WINNERS HERE.

Last quarter no one solved the trivia question: Every Harley rider has to have the obligatory black leather jacket. What year did Harley Davidson begin selling these popular items? It was 1928.

The story of the leather motorcycle jacket appropriately starts in the basement of a tenement building on the Lower East Side of Manhattan. Two brothers of Russian immigrants, Irving and Jack Schott, sat at a draft table. They were sketching furiously; drawing, erasing, and re-drawing with great zeal.

The Schott Brothers, who were friends with the Beck family, one of the largest distributors of Harley-Davidson at the time, were able to sell them through their merchandise catalog. By 1928, the Schott Brothers were selling the first ever leather motorcycle jacket through the Becks' merchandise catalog for \$5.50 (which equals about \$85 in today's money).

It wasn't until 1928 that the brand released the world's first motorcycle jacket – named the Perfecto – for Harley Davidson no less.




The restaurant was given the name Nesity Burgers, as a spin-off to the mysterious Loch Ness Monster, spelled Nessie.



Regional Officers Connection


