Membership Meeting Minutes

October 21, 2025

1. Ken Cornett opened the meeting at James Third Base Sports Bar and Grill by welcoming members to the June Powder Keg Chapter meeting.
2. Ken led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Ken then recognized Military Service Veterans and members, First Responders, parents of veterans and current serving military personnel and thanked them for their service.
4. No one from the dealership was in attendance this evening.
5. Mark came up to discuss the upcoming elections for 2026. At this time, we had no one express interest in either the director or secretary positions. As in years past, Bob has generously offered to pick up everyone's packet before the ride, to make it easier that morning, not to have to "hike" to the registration area.
7. Ed then asked Steve Isaacs to come up and present Steve with his road captain patch. He did his rocker ride with the road captains only so that this ride could be led by a Trike.
8. Frank spoke about the riding season on a whole and how great it was, even with the weather not always cooperating. He then went on to explain about a survey that he would be sending out to the chapter to get feed-back on what was good, areas that could be improved, and other suggestions such as ride destinations and lunch stop options.

10. Rick for Safety then talked about safety; specifically threat detection.

According to the Ohio Motorcycle safety program this is identified as:

S – Search. Always scan your surroundings as to what can be a potential threat.

I – Identify. Recognize potential hazards, or anything that can harm you.

P – Predict. Anticipate what could happen next and potential outcomes.

D – Decide. Choose your best course of action with what you have identified.

E – Execute. Carry out your decided action. This could mean covering your brake, to applying the brakes, changing lanes, or whatever you decide will keep you safe.

The MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) has applied the same theories, but streamlined it down to 3 steps:

S – Search.

E – Evaluate.

E – Execute.

They both are ways to stay safe and decide “what is trying to hurt you” and “how can I avoid it?”

Takes Rick Money – What and when are the tires considered “cold?” Dan Jacobs answered, “When the bike has been stopped, 3 hours or more or when driven less than a mile at moderate speed”.

Bonus question – How did Powder Keg get its name? “Kelly Lee answered, “from the cartridge factory”. When they were purchased by American Power Sports, the tried to name their locations after local landmarks,
