



She had a way of saying no that would make the hair of my neck stand up straight so that was the end of that. It wasn't until her death at the age of 17 that I debated skipping out on college to ride motorcycles across the country in an effort to be free, to be free of the pain of losing her, and to see the country alone. However, I had many good role models in my life that showed me that continuing with my education was the better decision. On their advice, I tucked that desire to feel the wind in my face at 90mph into the back regions of my soul only to awaken again in my 40s.

Shortly after meeting my now beautiful wife Jackie we were invited to go on a surfing trip in Nicaragua of all places. See there is a beach down there just outside Tola, Nicaragua that breaks so perfectly, over and over, you just don't want to leave. We rented a Spanish style beachfront home steps from the water, and between the dark rum and the water, I hadn't the slightest clue that my life was about to change. We had a few days where the waves just died. When you are used to riding 6-8 ft waves on either a surfboard or bodyboard (boogie board for you Texans) there is a part of you that wants to curse at the ocean and stay inside when the swell drops the waves to 1-2 feet. In an effort to see some of the country, and keep some of our sanity, all of us decided that we were going to ride motorcycles for the week. What a great way to kill time right? The place we rented them from was this dingy little motorcycle shop within the gated beach community we were staying. These weren't Harleys. If you think I was going to tell you that I hopped on top of a Road Glide after 32 years of not sitting on a bike I am sorry to disappoint you. We had no such luck. I rode a black and blue YZ 250 that had definitely done some miles. This bike was pretty bad. The front brakes were almost out. I blew a tire in the middle of Tola. My helmet smelled like some of the locals had used it for a bedpan. The first time I rode it I didn't know how to use the clutch. One of my best friends had to get on the back of the bike with me and show me how to work the gas and clutch. I will spare you all the comments that came my way. How embarrassing right? To make matters worse, 2 of my friends combined for 6 accidents during the trip. The last accident got one of them sent to the local hospital for


stitches. By all accounts I should not have loved this as much as I did. I should have wanted to throw the bike in a ditch and left it there. I didn't. Passion Awoken.

My then fiancé and I made it back to San Diego a couple weeks later. I immediately got my endorsement and I met my neighbor at the California DMV and told him what I was doing. Serendipitously, he was in dire need of selling his Harley, and at the time was hiding out from Harley Finance who was looking to repo the bike for missed payments. Unbeknownst to me at the time, I had been parking in front of my soon to be motorcycle every day for 2 years. I knew the bike well. It was an old 2008 Fat Bob and I loved her. I was way too big for that bike but I loved her nonetheless. I rode that bike all over the California coast. When we left California for Chicago back in 2019 that bike is what kept me sane during the pandemic. The only mask I liked wearing was a Harley Davidson helmet. I rode that bike every day I could until we ended up here in Texas a few years after and I traded her in for the bike I ride now.

It is a pleasure to meet you all. I hope every single one of you loves to ride as much as I do. We are all here because we either love to ride, or we love someone who loves to ride. I hope to get to know each and every one of you better. I am thankful and humbled to lead our chapter into 2026 and I promise to be a good steward of this club while I am in a position of leadership. If you ever want to chat about bikes, about the club, or about life reach out to me anytime. We are lucky to have such a wonderful passion. Always remember why you are here.
