



Honoring Our Veterans

ED LISLE SP4, US ARMY (1975-1978)

I write this article in honor of my father, a true veteran.

My father was a 14-year Navy veteran serving towards the end of the WWII era. His final station was in Japan where he met my mother. It was important to my father that I was born on American soil. After one month returning to the US, I was born at Aberdeen Washington where I was raised and lived most of my life in the Pacific Northwest. During my first year of college and watching teacher unions picketing, I lost the passion and fire to be a teacher and track coach. At the time, I did not know what to do and was lost having many personal conflicts in my life at the time. In exploring the military as an option and talking to some of my father's Navy buddies, they suggested that I do something technical in a promising new emerging computer industry. I had no clue what a computer was at that time but I was pretty good in math.

The only computer related training I could find at the time was in the US Army. They almost did not accept me for I had flat feet as I convinced them that I was an extremely fit, a fast runner and could handle boot camp just fine. 1975 was during the post Vietnam era, I signed up and started boot camp at Ft Ord in Monterey, then off to Ft Gordon Signal Corp in August Georgia where I earned Specialist 4 by accelerating through as top of my class. During physical training exercise I was able to log a 4:06 minute mile running in Army boots in which totally surprised even myself. After a year of training, I was assigned to the 1st Cav Division, Headquarters and Headquarters Command at Ft Hood Killeen Texas for my first duty post. I recall seeing my first Harley Davidson motorcycle where one of my buddies just purchased a Sportster. I was jealous and curious as growing up I rode bikes starting at the age of 14. Since all of the IBM mainframe equipment was under contract with IBM and I was not able to touch the equipment. After the first year of handling the division's communications encryption handbooks and FM radio punch downs, I requested to attend a self-paced computer mainframe operations school at Ft Benjamin Harris since my original MOS was terminated and career wise I was lost once again. After completion of operations school, I returned to Ft Ord in Monterey California operating the posts IBM 360 mainframe computer during the graveyard shift. I still did not know how the computer was going to change the world.

I did consider re-enlistment if I could attend satellite repair school however I was turned down since I was not an E5. I thought satellites were the next big thing. After not being eligible for promotion, I left the Army in 1978 and headed to Oregon where I eventually started a new career at Intel Corporation due to my military mainframe computer experience. Now with over 30+ years at Intel, I'll always be grateful to the military in providing me an opportunity to build a career, become a disciplined individual and the birth of my first son. Unfortunately I did not serve overseas or defend my country since I served during peacetime and the rebuilding of a new age military. For that, it's difficult for me to be considered a veteran as I have a higher respect for those who served.



Over the last 10 years with my father suffering with medical issues, I learned that he rode a 1948 baby blue Harley Davidson pan head springer. I found a beat up old picture of his bike in his wallet. The other picture has an interesting kidney belt that he wore which is a different story that I'll tell another day. One day, I decided to make the leap and purchase a 2008 Dyna Fat Bob and rode the bike to show my father while he was near his last days. It really made his day to see both of his sons riding Harleys before his passing.

I owe the military my life. Because of the Navy, I was born. Because of the Army, I have a career and new life worth living. And I ride a Harley!
